
History:





- *End 1980s. Lima Belgium, Euvita/Aldis Italy and Urtekram Denmark work out an initiative of Loek uit het Broek to create a private world-wide guarantee system. Boudewijn van Elzakker joins later. The initiative is abandoned in favour of an IFOAM approach (cfr IOAS)
- *BioFach February 2007. Boudewijn van Elzakker & Carol Haest discuss the fraud problem.
- *Bonn, May 2007 Hosted by the Bundesministry and facilitated by FiBL, AgroEco and GfRS 17 stakeholders meet and found the AFI.
- *Frick (Zürich), October 2007 Hosted by FiBL 60 steakholders continue the AFI initiative. A Code of Conduct is seen as the ultimate goal.

*September 2009 Bologna. Work is continued; the name AFI is abandoned. Alexander Beck (AOEL), Bo van Elzakker (Louis Bolk Institute), Beate Huber (FiBL), Bavo van den Idsert (VBP), Jan Wicher Krol (EOCC) and Jochen Neuendorff (GfRS) coordinate with Udo Buerk (BioTropic) in a strong supporting role. During the Biofach 2009 the initiative presented the two codes of conduct. The code of conduct for certification bodies 🔁 was signed by 21 certifiers 🔁 (17 in Europe, 2 in the USA, 1 in Argentina and 1 in Israel).

The code of conduct for trades was presented by Bavo van den Idbert. The trading and processing associations will continue the elaboration of the code. At the Sana fair in Bologna (10-13 September 2009) the complete code with practical toolboxes should be presented.
